

This generous funding is provided to assist families in meeting the cost of the excursion under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate program. The rebate is paid directly to the school upon completion of the excursion. This is an amazing contribution which has greatly assisted us in keeping costs down for families.

more spectacular art works and were especially interested in the famous Jackson Pollock painting 'Blue Poles'. We all landed safely and happily in Adelaide on Thursday evening after a busy and fun four days!
