
BOOK WEEK PARADE

ENROLMENTS FOR 2025

We are currently mapping out how 2025 will look for our school. We would appreciate any anticipated changes in enrolments to be communicated to the front office as soon as possible.

We are open for enrolments in all year levels from Reception to Year 9.

We ask that an Application for Enrolment form be filled out for any new children starting in 2025 in any year level. (For Receptions this includes both at the beginning of the year and mid-year intake). Enrolment packs can be picked up from the front office at any time.

Please be aware that we have a **TWO INTAKE POLICY for Reception.** Please see below the relevant dates and school intakes for new Receptions:

- The criteria for starting Reception on the first day of school in **Term 1** continues to be that the child will attain the age of 5 on or before 30th April in that year.
- The criteria for starting Reception on the first day of school in **Term 3** is that the child will have attained the age of 5 on or before 31st October in that year.
- Children starting in Reception in Term 3 will have a minimum of 6 terms in Reception
- Children whose birthday falls between 1 November and 31 December are not eligible to commence school before the following year.

RECEPTION/YEAR 1



Use of the data

National School Improvement Partnerships will report the results to the school in an aggregated format. To enable drilldown reporting, the information provided to the school will contain data based on background information. This anonymous data will be provided to CESA for reporting and consideration of support for schools.

How to complete the survey

- For each statement, you are asked to rate how well you think the school is performing by selecting one of six responses.
 The responses are numbered 1 to 6, with number 1 being the lowest or worst rating and number 6 being the highest or best rating.
- If you have more than one child at the school, and your perceptions differ for each child, please respond with respect
 to your perceptions related to the oldest child enrolled at the school.
- There are no 'right' or 'wrong' answers. Your opinion is what is wanted.
- · Please answer all questions.
- Some statements may be fairly similar to other statements. Don't worry about this. Simply give your opinion about all statements.
