#### NAPLAN

NAPLAN Testing for Year 3, 5, 7 and 9 students commenced last week and continues this week with the Conventions of Language and Numeracy Tests. These tests provide useful data for individual achievement in comparison with national results and are a means of identifying needs at each year level. They are, however, one mode of assessment in the overall learning program and St Joseph's School uses a variety of assessment strategies.

Any students who missed a test due to absenteeism will have the opportunity to catch up their missed test/s this week. We wish all students well for the remainder of their NAPLAN tests and are proud of each student for their efforts.


### SCHOOL NEWS




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#### Year 5/6 News
